Term	Definition	Symbol
Perspective	Authors reveal their unique viewpoint or perspective in a text through their attitude (tone), beliefs, and opinions about the subject matter.	
	<ul> <li>To determine the author's perspective, ask yourself,</li> <li>What's the author's purpose for writing?</li> <li>What is the author's opinion or attitude about the subject?</li> <li>What is the author's purpose for expressing this attitude or opinion?</li> </ul>	
Tone	Tone refers to the author's attitude toward a subject. Tone is established in a text through:  • Word choice (diction)  • Details the author chooses to include	
Diction	Diction refers to the choice of words and style of expression an author uses in a text.  Diction impacts the tone and mood in a piece of writing.	
Voice	Voice is what sets apart a writer's work from other authors' writings on the same subject matter. It's the author's personality coming through on the page through language use and word choice (diction).
