- Include at least one example from the book to back up your opinion.

Paragraph 4: SHORT Recommendation

- Who would you recommend this book to? What kind of reader would enjoy this book? (just a few sentences here)
- End with a 5-Star Rating: 1 being the worst, 5 being the best; Half-stars can be used as well
